



#### SPECTATORS

Spectators are the privileged audience of the players and are obligated to remain silent at all times, including breaks in match play.

Each player has the right to demand that any spectator(s) leave the area, without explanation.

Both players must agree before a spectator may be consulted regarding a dispute.

Signaling between spectator and player will result in their both being expelled from the tournament.

The effect of spectator's intervention must be adjudicated by an official.

#### DEFINITIONS

The Crawford Rule applies in all matches. When the first opponent reaches match point (one point less than is needed to win the match, e.g., 16 points in a 17 point match) the subsequent game, and that subsequent game only, is governed by the Crawford Rule. "The doubling cube is *not* used in this one specific game of the match." If the match continues beyond this game, the doubling cube may once again be used immediately after the opponent's first move.

A *gammon* (a score worth twice the effective cube number to the winner) occurs when the winner has borne off all his men before his opponent bears off any of his men.

A *backgammon* (a score worth triple the effective cube number to the winner) occurs when the winner has borne off all his men while his opponent has one or more men on the bar, or in the winner's home board.

A *dispute* is that event which occurs whenever the two opponent's are unable to resolve a circumstance in their match. They are then required to have an Official adjudicate the matter. An *Official* is a member of the Tournament staff, committee or other person authorized to make such rulings.

Rulings by Officials shall be made in accordance with the Tournament Rules, or according to their own discretion where the Rules allow it, or where the Rules do not cover the circumstance in question.

#### **DOUBLING CUBE**

It is the responsibility of both players to see that the doubling cube begins each game centered on the bar with the "64" side up.

Duplicate opening rolls do not advance the cube (i.e., no "automatic double") as players must reroll when this occurs.

A player may double only before rolling his dice. He may not double immediately following a voided roll.

The proper method for doubling your opponent is to announce "I double," advancing the cube number and moving it toward your opponent, on his side of the playing surface.

To properly accept a double, announce "I accept," or "I take," while placing the doubling cube on your edge of the board.

A player rejects a double by announcing "I refuse," or "I pass," scoring his loss and preparing his men for the next game.

Any single one of the above acts, or any similar, unambiguous verbal or physical act is binding upon the player.

A roll made before a double has been accepted or refused is void.

When a player has no legal move, and thus, no need to roll his dice when it is his turn, his opponent must still pause between rolls so that the player may double, should he wish.

Other than the obvious oversights which an official will adjudicate (a cube lost or centered on the bar at "16"), the position of a disputed cube will be deemed valid as it lies at that point.

## California Open Backgammon Championships

June 1 - 3, 1979

Tournament Rules of the American Backgammon Players Association

#### **GENERAL PROCEDURES**

Only official tournament equipment may be used.

Unless previously announced, all match pairings and necessary by awards shall be made by random public draw.

Players must review rules before match play. Players unfamiliar with any of the Tournament Rules are encouraged to discuss these rules with an official. Match opponents accept mutual responsibility for compliance with the Tournament Rules.

Tournament entries are subject to the approval of the Tournament Committee.

Unless otherwise announced by the Tournament Director, the official language of the Tournament is English. Players may not converse with spectators during a match except to request conveniences, i.e., beverages, cigarettes, etc.

No books, or mechanical aids, such as calculators, may be used during a match. No calculations may be made on paper.

Players are each limited to a maximum of two fiveminute breaks during a match.

Very slow play may result in a penalty being imposed.

Only one hand may be used to move the men during play.

A player has completed his play only when he lifts his dice from the playing surface. Should the opponent prematurely roll (before the player has picked up his dice) that premature roll is automatically void (including non-contact positions) and must be rerolled after the play in progress has been completed. There are no options.

Once a player has picked up his dice, he may not make any adjustment or change any placement of men whatsoever. This includes placing men on, or removing them from, the bar. In the case of an error, or illegal play, his opponent may either demand that the move be replayed, or alternatively insist that it remain without correction, including a forced hit that is overlooked. This option is void once the opponent rolls his dice. Once that next roll has been made, any subsequently discovered error must remain as is, and cannot be altered by either player. There is no option. An incorrect number of men in play will be played as is for the duration of that game. A player with 14 men in play may still be gammoned or backgammoned.

A player must play his entire roll — if possible. If part of a roll is playable and part of it is not, the part of the roll which may be played *must* be played. If either number on the dice, but not both, may be played, the higher number must be played.

Should a player wish to use the left side of the board for rolling, he must secure his opponent's verbal permission before doing so, or the roll is void at his opponent's option. Once permission is secured, or when the illegal roll is allowed, then the player may continue to roll on the left until he rolls again on the right.

#### PENALTIES

Penalty points may be assessed for repeated minor offenses.

Behavior not covered by a specific rule, but deemed by the Officials contrary to acceptable Tournament behavior may be cause for disgualification.

Whenever penalty points are assessed against a player, these points are added to his opponent's score.

Promptness is expected of all participants. Penalty points will be assessed beginning 15 minutes after the scheduled starting time.

#### DISPUTES

In the event of any dispute, all of the men, dice, and the doubling cube are to be left as is while an Official is called.

The decision of the Tournament Officials is final.

A high roll wins the choice of direction of play or color of men. No changes in format are allowed once a match has begun.

An incorrect starting position may be corrected only until the conclusion of the fourth play of the game.

#### SCORING

Both players must keep score and confirm for accuracy after each game.

The player with no score record will be at a disadvantage in a scoring dispute.

The loser validates the match results by signing the winner's score sheet.

It is the responsibility of both players to be aware of the posted point total for the current round.

All matches must be played to the point total as posted for that round of play.

A match played to an insufficient number of points must be resumed upon discovery.

A match played to an excessive number of points, will be reviewed to determine the player who first reached the posted point total for that round. Only if this cannot be determined, does the earlier report stand.

Unless an incorrect point total result is reported to an Official before the winner begins his next match, it must stand as originally reported.

Any private alteration or settlement is cause for disqualification, including unauthorized changes in match play points, site or time.

#### DICE

When not in play, dice and cups must remain stationary on the table.

Either player may mix the dice, but only between games.

To begin each roll, both dice must be shaken vigorously in the cup and thrown out together onto the board on the player's right.

Both dice must land flat on the playing surface on the right side of the board. Any variation voids the entire roll.

Should a player roll so that one die hits the table before the other die leaves the cup, that voids the entire roll.

Physical interference before the dice settle legally does not invalidate a roll.






